Since 2003, the Pacific Risk Management Ohana (PRiMO) has been bringing people and organizations together to share knowledge, increase collaboration, and build resilient communities. The 2017 PRiMO Conference will focus on "Navigating Towards" Security and Sustainability." We invite researchers, scholars, and scientists to submit abstracts for papers and posters focused on the important connections between security and sustainability. We seek contributions that define the complex and evolving nature of human, environmental, urban and geo-political security. How can science, knowledge, and technology better serve communities to make them safer and more resilient to natural and man-made threats and hazards? We anticipate contributions from planning, architecture, engineering, public health, and many allied disciplines working on problems of security and sustainability at the neighborhood, community, urban, regional, island, national and global scales. While PRiMO has traditionally focused on islands in the Asia Pacific, we are interested in sharing knowledge, ideas, practices and experiences across diverse cultures and communities from around the world. Islands provide an excellent opportunity to address local and global problems and solutions related to climate, food, energy, water, and human security.

Send us a 500-word abstract with 4-5 keywords describing your research interests. Include a statement as to how your ideas can contribute to PRiMO (see **www.primohui.org** for a background on our organization). We welcome participation across disciplines at various stages of knowledge generation. Please indicate if you will be submitting a full paper (5,000 words) or a poster (requirements to be provided upon abstract acceptance). We have assembled an international scientific committee to review abstracts and final contributions. The papers will be published online in proceedings made available at the time of the conference and may also be included as part of future book and journal special issue projects.
